

Teacher's Notes

Statue

Colour in the Brian Clough statue. Show picture of real statue but this one can be coloured in.

Design a statue to your own hero. Think about how they would be posed, standing, sitting or even running. Use pictures, books or other sculptures to help you.

You could also look at materials that statues/art are made of you could also look at other sculpture in the Park. The owl made of oak, the His-tree is also made of wood, Crystallisation is made of steel, and Brian is made of bronze. Why are they made out of these materials? You could also look at where sculpture or monuments are sited.

Albert's Football Friends

These are fun sheets to colour in.

The children could name the characters or design their own character. They could also write a football inspired story about Albert's football team.

Wordsearches

There is one small wordsearch and one large wordsearch for children to complete.

They could even have a go at creating their own wordsearch, crossword or word ladder.

Funky Faces

Inspired by artist Andy Warhol's images of famous people can you create a Brian Clough that has been coloured in the same way. Use Warhol images to inspire the children. You could also use texture.

Football Strip

Please design the football strip for Albert.

You could work out a cutting pattern and how much material is needed to make this new strip and what price would they need to sell it at to cover costs.

Brian Clough Timeline

Pupils will need Brian Clough biography to assist with this activity.

The class could discuss which historical events could be put on the timeline.

Ace Reporter

Have a look at the quotes and think of a story that could be created using one of them. Don't forget to include the quote.

If the children have time they could always draw a picture to go with their article.

Football Pitch

Using a football pitch to explore symmetry and shapes. There are also a couple of questions relating to area and perimeter.

Football Sudoku

There are two puzzles. The easy grid is the four grid and the medium is the six grid. We have used objects instead of numbers. The counters can be cut out to help.
